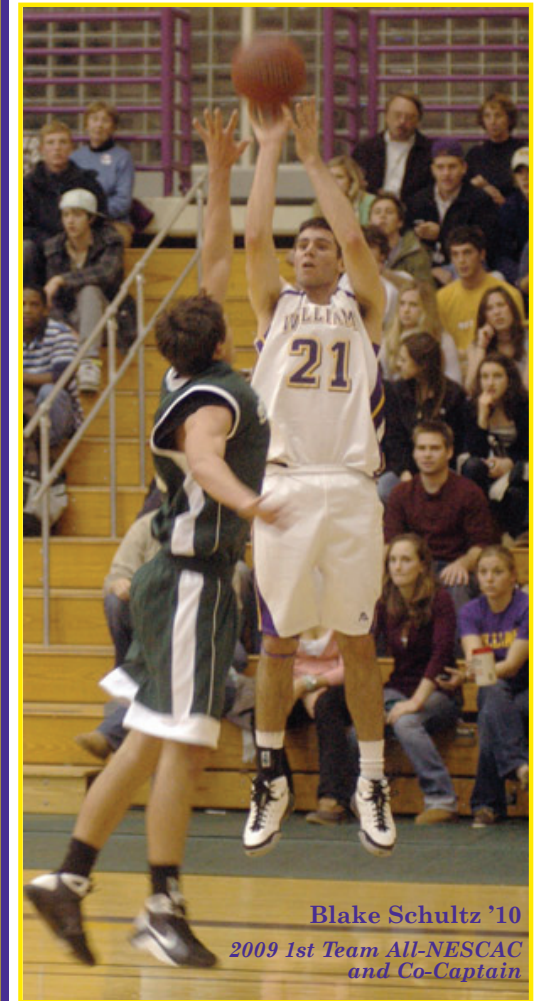

# Coaching Staff



In his first year as the head basketball coach at Williams College, Mike Maker helped guide the Ephs to 17 wins and their first outright Little Three Championship since 1996.

Prior to joining the Williams basketball family, Maker assisted Dana Altman at Creighton for one season,

where the Bluejays advanced to the second round of the NIT and recorded 20 wins and 10 conference wins for the tenth straight year (a feat matched only by Kansas).

Maker also assisted current Michigan head coach John Beilein for two seasons at West Virginia. During that time, the Mountaineers won the 2007 NIT and advanced to the 2006 NCAA Sweet 16.

Throughout his 21 years in collegiate coaching, (17 at the Division I level), Maker's mentors have included the aforementioned Altman and Beilein, as well as Jimmy Tillette (Samford) and Dave Faucher (Dartmouth).

Mike Maker will be assisted by his staff: Kevin App and Patrick Doherty. Also, some members of the Williams men's basketball team and invited coaches will be on hand to help teach campers the fundamentals of basketball.

# College Prospects Camp

The camp is intended for players who are serious about playing at the collegiate level. ## Information and Registration:

The Prospect Camp will begin with registration in Chandler Gymnasium on **Sunday, June 28 from 1:00 p.m. – 3:00 p.m.** The camp will conclude by **Noon on Tuesday, June 30.**

Tuition is \$350 for resident campers, which includes meals, housing in dorms, instruction and a reversible practice jersey. \$300 for commuter (includes meals).

A \$100.00 nonrefundable deposit will reserve a camper's place with the full balance due no later than one week prior to the first day of camp.

*Many campers use their camp experience as an early college visit. This provides an opportunity to sample dormitory living and campus dining, while becoming familiar with the Williams campus, community, and coaching staff.*
